Splinter of the Mind's Eye

To celebrate the birth of the **Expanded Universe**, Fan Force Portugal brings to the top the 1978 novel written by Alan Dean Foster – **Splinter** of the **Mind's Eye**.

The first edition came out in March 1st 1978, not even a year after **Star Wars** was revealed to the world. Interestingly enough, the book was published by **Del Rey Books**, The same publisher that has held the rights for Star Wars novels from 1999 through 2008.

The thing that seems to be the funniest is that although the novelisation of the first Star Wars movie is known, or thought, to have been entirely written by George Lucas, the fact is that author Alan Dean Foster did have a major role in the writing. That is, actually, why he was chosen for this project, although **Splinter of the Mind's Eye** was meant to be some sort of a sequel to the episode that we now know as **A New Hope**, in case it didn't have such a great success.

But it did, and as a new sequel was being produced, **Splinter of the Mind's Eye** was published as a means of following the story of **Luke Skywalker** and his friends in their neverending fight against **Darth Vader** and the **Galactic Empire**.

As the **Rebel Alliance** struggles to convice more and more sistems in joining their cause against **Palpatine**'s tyranny, Leia Organa, Luke Skywalker and the droids **C-3PO** and **R2-D2** travel to **Circapous** si in a diplomatic mission to arrange a metting that will, propably, bring in another planet to the Rebellion.

Finally, in May 7th 2007, João Carreira was officially accepted as Sandtrooper TD9976 and shortly, in June 19th 2007 the Lusitanian Outpost was finally approved and officially launched.

Both steps were important to the Portuguese Fans, not only did we sign in the very first Portuguese Member of the 501st Legion, but an Official Outpost was born in our country, bringing the 501st might to Portugal.

You see, the 501st Legion is not just a group of costumers, it's also a charity organization that brings to children and grown children, the magic of Star Wars, especially those blessed by health that need to rely on hospitals and institutions to survive. The 501st brings this magic with visits and events, but also by attending other events where it is invited free of charge but with the condition that the requester places a donation to one of the many organizations that help children or other people with special needs.

We're still young in terms of existence. But we already appeared in some events, like an exhibit in Lisbon, Celebration Europe and 30th Anniversary of Star Wars in Portugal, back in December 6th 2007.

The future... We have several people developing suits, not only Imperials but also denizens and others. All of them with the same spirit of joining the World's Largest Star Wars Costuming Group (Guinness World Record). All of them sharing João's dream... and my own...

As for me... My Red Guard is still on hold... but I'll wear that mask... someday!

Steve Sansweet is perhaps the most known face in Lucasfilm's Marketing, he's responsible for Fan Relations and the world's greatest Star Wars memorabilia collector. He is also **Fan Force Portugal's Honorary Member** and a great friend. It was only natural Fan Force Portugal, should make this interview with one of the most influent persons in the Fandom universe.

FFPT - We all know Mr. Sansweet is, perhaps the biggest collector of Star Wars. How did it really begin?

Steve - I've always been a collector. It started with soda-bottle caps, matchbook covers, baseball cards—the usual stuff when I was a kid. I also grew up loving science fiction— books, movies, and TV. I had started collecting space toys such as Japanese tin robots just before Star Wars premiered. The movie blew me away and I started finding items to buy. But truly, my first Star Wars collectible had come months before the movie opened. A fellow reporter at the Wall Street Journal received in the mail the brochure that 20th Century Fox sent to theatres to try to get them to book the film. He looked it over and threw it in his wastebasket. After he left for the day, I went over, dug it out of the trash—and still own it today!

FFPT - Is there any item you pursuit that never got the chance to add to your collection? **Steve** - Of course! All the time! I am not a wealthy man—although I spend much of my income on Star Wars items. There are many things that I would like that I have to either pass up or someone else buys because they are willing and able to spend more than I can.

FFPT - What is the object you value the most? Not necessarily the most expensive.

Steve - It's not a single object, but a class of objects: fan-made items that I have either bought or that have been given to me as gifts. I probably now have a dozen or more Steve Sansweet action figures that fans have made of me—including one with long pointy ears and a Yoda-green face! I have a large Bantha piñata that won a craft contest in Mexico City, and a full-size Wampa costume from the same convention. A friend in Mexico also makes one-of-a-kind Star Wars vehicles out of tinplate. I have a great piece of R2-D2 stained glass. And I love the patches and other items that the 501st and Rebel Legion makes just for their own members.

FFPT- We've seen the evolution of Rancho Obi-Wan in Hyperspace videos "Visit Rancho Obi-Wan". What's the future of this space? Would you like to make it a Museum someday? Steve - Well, it already is a museum—although a private one. Because of local government restrictions, it will always be private, but I still do occasional tours for charities and for fans that come to the area. That becomes more and more difficult, and must be limited, because I just don't have the time while working fulltime, writing more Star Wars books in my personal time, and trying to pay at least some attention to my collection.

FFPT- Collecting can be a painful process. Can you share a story that you feel better pictures this arduous hobby?

Steve - Well it's certainly painful to my wallet and bank account!;) And it takes a lot of time and effort to keep up with it all. But I certainly wouldn't call it arduous; once a hobby becomes "arduous," it's time to drop it and move on.

FFPT - Why is it so fascinating to collect Star Wars memorabilia?

Steve - I think the movies awakened or kept alive the child in all of us. These were breakthrough movies and captured the imagination of people worldwide. Collecting memorabilia from the series helps us keep those memories very much alive...and close by.
